**End of the Semester  
Acceleration Program**

Families that are due to PCS can request an acceleration of schoolwork so students can complete their semester credits before moving to another school. DODEA policy permits PSCing students to complete their semester 20 days early. This year, a student can request to accelerate and finish first semester as of 11 December 2008. Families must request this acceleration by letter to the principal at least 30 days before the student's last day. Students must complete all work and tests before their last day of school.

Acceleration is not easy for any student and can have a negative effect on a student's grades. The fewer school days a PSCing student misses, the easier the transition

from LHS will be. Contact your guidance counselor for more information.

## FAFSA – Start it now!!

The **FAFSA** (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) is required by most colleges as part of their financial aid application process. The information on the FAFSA is based on your family's 2006 Federal Income Tax. It is recommended you file this application as early as possible with 1 February being ideal (Tax returns can be delayed till April 1<sup>st</sup>). The earlier you file the better

Experience shows that completing the FAFSA on-line is the most reliable method.

Go online to [www.fafsa.ed.gov](http://www.fafsa.ed.gov) and apply for your pin number! Remember this is a free service of the Department of Education. If there is a fee requested you are in the wrong web site.

## What is your EFC?

EFC or Expected Family Contribution is the portion of the tuition, books and living expenses that comes from your family's income. The EFC is calculated from the information you submit when completing the FAFSA.

An estimate of your EFC can be calculated at the Financial Aid Estimator located at [www.act.org](http://www.act.org) or [www.collegeboard.com](http://www.collegeboard.com). This web site also has practice materials for taking the ACT and SAT.

## FAQ of Guidance Counselors

What is the CEEB number for our school? The CEEB or school code number for Lakenheath HS is 575-020. Using this number tells colleges and other organizations that you are a student at LHS.

## Turning 18 Soon?

Upon reaching the age of 18 all boys are required to register with the Selective Service. This is required by law and can be done easily on line at [www.sss.gov](http://www.sss.gov) at no cost. Students must complete this registration before they can receive any federal financial aid for college.

## PSAT Results Presentation

A presentation for sophomore and junior students and their parents will be held on the Tuesday, 09 Dec 2008 at 1800 in the Information Center (library) to review and interpret PSAT scores. The PSAT taken in October will help students and parents to consider ways to prepare for taking the SAT or ACT. Mark your calendars!!

## Testing Dates SY 08-09

Below are the ACT and SAT testing dates and registration deadlines for the current school year. Directions for SAT online registration are on pages 12-13. Students must pick up an ACT online registration form from the counselors or Mrs. Bangs. This form includes a waiver number that will allow students to waive the international fee surcharge. (If students register without this waiver, their test will cost \$22 more, and their fee cannot be refunded.) Students should see their counselor with questions.

## Why take an SAT subject test?

1. Many colleges require or recommend taking one or more SAT subject Tests for admission or placement.
2. Even if a college does not require Subject Tests scores, having them can only help your application.
3. Subject Tests show your mastery of a specific subject or language.
4. Colleges may exempt you from a freshman course requirement.

## Seniors and College

Narrow your college choices to 5-10 colleges. Get an application and financial aid information for each school. Make a master calendar and note test dates, fees, and deadlines. Ask for recommendations. Give each person a resume and required forms. Write first drafts of your application essays and ask teachers, parents and friends to read them. Remember: think about what you want and find a school that is a good fit. Check out College Search at CollegeBoard.com. Make an appointment with Mr. Daugherty for help.

## Official Transcripts for college applications

Students must fill out a (yellow) transcript request form available in the counseling office that must be signed by both the student and their sponsor and returned to the office. For requests that official transcripts be mailed to colleges, the college address must also be printed legibly on the transcript request form. Remember to submit official transcript requests and other college application forms well before deadlines to allow time enough to complete and send to the college of your choice.

## Seniors

### If you are busy getting college applications together—think about this

In a recent College Board survey, 4-year colleges ranked their admission criteria based on responses from 1,917 institutions. The following criteria are considered "very important":

- School achievement 83%
- Test scores 59%
- Recommendation 19%
- Essay 17%
- Interview 14%
- Activities 4%

# Freshman Parents Need to Know

## 1. FRESHMAN YEAR COUNTS!

Did you know that freshman grades are more important than senior grades for college admission? Most college applications are made before seniors have completed their first semester. The transcript sent with the initial college application has ALL FRESHMAN GRADES and no senior grades! See how important freshman year is!

## 2. STUDYING vs HOMEWORK

How many times have you heard “Mom/Dad - I have finished (or do not have) homework!”? This may be true but as the graduation requirements have become more rigorous (26 credits and minimum 2.0 GPA) and subjects are more complex (Remember geometry? How about Punnett Squares in biology?), students find completing homework is not enough practice to really know and understand the material. An hour of studying every night reviewing, re-reading textbooks, practicing second language vocabulary and phrases, rewriting notes and essays, and doing extra problems can really pay off come test day. Reading current event magazines/ newspapers or a book from the DoDEA reading list during this study hour are other ways of preparing students for the rigors they will find in the classroom.

## 3. NOW IS THE TIME!

Freshman year is the time to start planning for meeting the cost of college. Families are expected to help pay for college along with any financial aid that might be received. This means looking at your family budget and the cost of college; discuss with your daughter/son the big decisions that need to be made. Too many times counselors hear parents and students say “I wish we had known this earlier!” Freshman year IS the year to start. Take advantage of school programs and counselors as well as the great resources found on the Internet.

## **Customer Satisfaction Survey: 2008-2009**

### **DoDEA and DoDDS Europe invite you to participate in our online biennial customer satisfaction survey**

The Department of Defense Education Activity (DoDEA) will administer its biennial Customer Satisfaction Survey (CSS) from November 1, 2008 through February 28, 2009. The CSS provides valuable feedback to DoDEA from its most important customers – parents and students – about the quality of education it provides and areas needing improvement.

All sponsors with students enrolled in DoD schools from Pre-kindergarten or SureStart through grade 12 may participate by completing a survey for each school in which they have a enrolled. Students in grades 4-12 may participate by completing separate surveys for students in grades 4-5, and students in grades 6-12.

The 2008 DoDEA Customer Satisfaction Survey represents a departure from tradition. Historically, teachers, educational support staff, students in grades 4-12, and sponsors for each child enrolled in DoD schools from pre-kindergarten through 12th grade were asked to complete the CSS. This year, parents and students will participate in the CSS while DoDEA Administrators, teachers, educational support staff will participate in a separate survey, the DoDEA Employee Satisfaction Survey, to be administered during March 2009. As with the CSS, participation in the DoDEA Employee Satisfaction Survey is voluntary and maximum participation is encouraged in order to obtain reliable and valid data.

The surveys take approximately 20 minutes to complete and are available online at [www.dodea.edu](http://www.dodea.edu). Parents who do not have access to the Internet should contact their child's school to determine other alternatives – such as using the school's computers.

Sponsors are asked to complete a survey for each child enrolled in a DoD school in grades pre-kindergarten/SureStart through grade 12. Information derived from the surveys will be used to improve planning efforts at all levels throughout DoDEA. Schools, districts and areas will use the survey results to gain insight into the satisfaction levels of sponsors and students, which is one of many measures used for future planning of programs and services DoDEA offers. The survey results will also be used to monitor the DoDEA Community Strategic Plan (CSP), which contains the strategic direction for DoDEA for the years 2006-2011.
